The Church now recommends that the Confirmation name be the same name given to you at Baptism since Confirmation is the affirmation and completion of your baptismal gifts, promises and acceptance into the Catholic Faith community. At your Confirmation you will speak for yourself in your own name as to your willingness to commit to the Church as once your parents and godparents did for you. If you decide that you want to select another special name, it should be based on who and what the person's name represents to you. What "saintly" qualities do you want to emulate because of this choice? When we are named, or chose a name, it says something about who we are! You will need to do some "homework" to assure us that you connect the importance of this tradition. A short written paragraph will be required about the saint and person behind the name you chose. Our parish RESOURCE LIBRARY has many short excerpts about the lives of the saints or you can go ONLINE to find information about any Saint in the Catholic Church or go to the PUBLIC LIBRARY. It must be a saint's name or a variation so a little history about that saint will be necessary and if you are selecting the name because of someone you admire today, please add that element to the report.
