Back to the Ordinary <u>St. Mark's Gospel</u>

Mark's Gospel was the first to be written (somewhere between the years 60 and 75). It is worth

paying considerable attention to because <u>Mark</u> invented "Gospel" as a literary form.

To be accurate, Mark was not writing a life of Jesus, or history, or biography, but recording good new (Gospel), which is to say he is going to recount the saving works for God.

Jesus' first saving work, his first public work, is a confrontation with the powers of darkness, the "demons." Jesus confronts all that deforms and distorts human life.

When we were baptized, our parents and godparents were asked a three-fold question on our behalf:

"Do you reject Satan?
and all his works?
and all his empty promises?"

Evil has many faces, shapes and disguises. Mark records Jesus teaching 17 times in the **synagogue** (sacred place) on the **Sabbath** (sacred time) - a good reminder that **real change** comes through what we are doing here-right now- worship and prayer.


