One of the great paradigms of repentance is the wonderful Biblical tale of Jonah the Prophet.

Not without reason is it read in synagogue on the feast of Yom Kippur.

God teaches Jonah not to be cynical, to always maintain faith in the possibility of human transformation. The Prophet had longed for God to destroy the wicked city of Nineveh, but God reminds Jonah that "many there do not know their right hand from their left." (Jonah 4:11)

God does not want to destroy, but to see lives transformed. In short, God is a God of second chances; many second chances.

Through apology, repair, and attempting to heal damage done, we effectively rewrite the past.

This Lent, give someone a second chance and let the healing begin.




As we journey through Lent and approach Palm Sunday and Holy Week, let us walk with Jesus as he prepared for the ultimate sacrifice.

For the month of February, we served 416 individuals from nine towns. Your

continuous support is much appreciated, especially since we are experiencing an increase each week. In the last week of February, our count was 31 families. Last year, we averaged 25 a week.

As we aim to be as sustainable as possible, any extra reusable bags you have around your home are welcome at the Pantry. Just drop off in the Student Center vestibule; we have a bin there for your convenience.
