

- 2. Am I spending too much time on my low priorities? If so, how can I reduce this?

- 4. Things are wasting my time? How can I minimize them?
- 5. Am I trying to do too much myself? What activities can I safely delegate?
- 6. Do I waste other people's time? How can I behave differently?
- 7. How often do I take time off to pray, to relax, or just have time for myself?

The late Fr. John Powell, S.J., has written: "Every day we should do something that will expand us: we should win little victories over our fears that will widen our world and our lives." Whatever our reasons for wanting to manage time properly, it helps greatly if we reflect on the questions listed above. List what needs doing and give priority to the essentials.




