Christ the King Sunday

The Last Sunday of each Liturgical year has been set aside to celebrate the feast of Christ the King and His allembracing authority. All three readings are chosen to reflect that theme.

It was instituted in 1925, at the close of the jubilee year. At His trial, Jesus was questioned about His claim to be King. He was then in a most unkinglike state. The enigmatic statement, "My Kingdom is not of this world," throws the focus on the world of the Spirit. Unlike the popular perception of kingship, Jesus' Kingdom is one of service.

Bishop O'Neil used to say that the only power in the Church was the power to serve. To Serve is to love; and Christian love is rooted in the profound mystery of Jesus Christ, the true King of every human heart.

There will be designated boxes between the glass doors at the Student Center for coats and toys. Gift cards are accepted but please bring to the Office




