

## "THE BEGINNING IS ALWAYS TODAY"

I recently read <u>"Walking a</u> <u>Literary Labyrinth,"</u> A spirituality of reading, by Nancy Malone. I found the book in a

small book shop in Bethlehem, NH.

<u>Evelyn Underhill</u> (1985-1945), a popular English writer who wrote widely on mysticism and worship:

"Spiritual reading is, or at least can be, second only to prayer as a developer and supporter of the spiritual life."

<u>St. Augustine</u> describes his conversion, not only as a turning point, but as the birth of a new self.

"Tolle Lege," <u>"Take Up and Read,"</u> leads Augustine to an act of self-transcendence.

The late Polish Nobel Laureate, <u>Czeslaw Milosz</u> (1911-2004), commenting on the evils of the last century pointed to certain writers whom he considered beacons of hope: The French philosopher and mystic <u>Simone Weil</u>, writer <u>Albert Camus</u>, and Trappist Monk <u>Thomas Merton</u>. Each of whom provided a depth of ideas for spiritual seekers.

So life is short, read well. Malone advised, "Why spend time reading only currently popular books most destined to be forgotten." Seek out those that have endured by writers such as <u>Austin</u>, <u>Dickens</u>, <u>Dostoevsky</u>, <u>Tolstoy</u>, <u>Willa Cather</u>, <u>James Joyce</u>, and <u>Henry James</u>, among others.

Take and Read (and don't forget poetry).



As a Partner Agency of the NH Food Bank, we are able to access food at a very reduced rate. For the year 2024, we purchased 84,193 pounds

of food equaling a fair market value of \$165,860. Overall for the State of New Hampshire, the NH Food Bank provided more than 17 million pounds of food for those who are food insecure in our state.

## Why the 200 Club?

The purpose of the 200 Club is to supplement the weekly collection in support of parish operations, programs and services. This additional revenue is required to offset variations in the weekly collections and the reduced income from some of the more traditional Parish fundraising activities. Specifically:

Our demographics are changing and the resources to conduct these traditional fundraising activities are diminishing.

Free time for many of our parishioners is an increasingly rare commodity making it difficult to engage in labor-intensive parish maintenance and fund-raising activities.

Despite aggressive expense controls, costs continue to rise for virtually all parish programs, pastoral, educational and diocesan as well as facilities maintenance, repair and utilities.

## 200 Club Rules

The Club is run by an administrative committee consisting of 4 Co-Chairs with the assistance of the St. Thomas More Finance committee.

The target is to have 200 members. Membership options are \$50 for a 3-month membership, \$100 for a 6-month membership and \$200 for a full year's membership.

Only parishioners can promote and/or solicit memberships.

Membership is open to all parishioners, relatives and friends 18 years of age and older. Membership numbers will be assigned on a first come/first served basis.

Numbers will be drawn monthly for 3 prizes: \$100, \$50 and \$25. Checks for prizes will be mailed to the lucky winners. Anniversary drawing prizes will be \$500, \$300 and \$100.

Only the numbers of members who are up to date in their monthly payments will be entered in the monthly drawing.

Members can win more than once.

After payment of prize money and related expenses, all revenues will become part of the St. Thomas More general fund. For the calendar year 2025, 200 Club revenues will be earmarked for support of the much-needed repairs and upgrades to the rectory.


