Gerard Manley Hopkins is buried in the Jesuit plot at Glasnevin Cemetery in Dublin. Fr. John and I prayed at his grave during our Golden Jubilee of Ordination travels in Ireland this June.

Hopkins was a convert of John Henry Newman while a classics student at Oxford University. The Jesuit priest and mystic died on 8, June, 1889, only weeks from his 45th birthday.

None of Hopkin's poetry was published during his lifetime. His work finally appeared in 1918, when it was published by his poet-friend, Robert Bridges.

#### O God, I Love Thee

O God I love Thee, I love Thee-Not out of hope of heaven for me Nor fearing not of love and be In the everlasting burning. Thou, Thou, my Jesus, after me. Didst reach Thine arms out dying, For my sake sufferedst nails and lance, Mocked and marred countenance, Sorrows passing number, Sweat and care and cumber, Yea and death, and this for me. And Thou couldst see me sinning: Then I, why should not I love Thee, Jesu, so much in love with me? Not for heaven's sake; not to be Out of hell by loving Thee; Not for any gains I see; But just the way that Thou didst me I do love and I will love Thee; What Must I love thee, Lord, for then? For being my King and God. Amen

#### TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us, while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith. For the sake of the joy that lay before him, he endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God."

Although we strive to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ it doesn't take much to learn we cannot do it alone. We find support, encouragement and strength in community, even if only a few with whom to dialogue and discuss Jesus in our lives. Several times we find Peter, as well as in this passage to 'keep our eyes fixed on Jesus.' That second or third person might be the answer.

The author describes sin as something clinging to us - like barnacles on a boat. We need to shed them to be free in running the race. We can anticipate the joy which lies before us, especially when we can share it with another person.
