

<u>Anniversary of</u> September 11th

It hardly seems possible that 24 years have passed since the tragedy and terror of September 11, 2001. This Thursday we mark the sad anniversary of the attacks on New York City's World Trade Center, the Pentagon and the airplane that crashed in the Pennsylvania countryside. Those fateful television images of blue sky, towering buildings and orange-black fireballs are seared in our minds.

Fr. Mychal Judge, a Franciscan priest, was chaplain to the New York city Fire Department. Standing beneath Tower Two, the beloved priest administered the final Sacrament to an unidentified fireman. When Father Judge removed his helmet to pray, he was killed by a rain of debris.

Writer Hampton Sides noted "They carried him to Saint Peter's, the oldest Roman Catholic Church in Manhattan, and laid him at the altar. Then they shrouded him in a white sheet and placed his helmet on his chest. Father Judge was the first recorded fatality of the Twin Tower tragedy. Literally, his death certificate was stamped '1'."

This wonderful priest died with a dying man in his arms. The homilist at his funeral Mass, Fr. Michael Duffy, said, "Fr. Judge was praying...he was talking to God, he was helping someone. Can we honestly think of a better way to die?"

So on this 24st Anniversary, I invite you to turn to the infinite resources of almighty God. May our God help us to Remember, to Heal and to Live.


St. Thomas More Food Pantry





September 13– John Chrysostom (d. 407) Bishop of Constantinople. Prophetic voice against the hypocritical rich and powerful. Noted preacher, called the "Golden-tongued". Died in exile for his devotion to the truth.


