The Two Parts of Advent



Part 1: up until December 16

While most liturgical seasons have the gospel as their main focus, during the first weeks of Advent, The Church gives us daily readings from the prophet Isaiah. With the eyes of faith, these foretell the coming of the Messiah. Rather than a continuous gospel narrative familiar to us for most of the year, this part of Advent offers a wide variety of gospel readings that support the first reading of the day.

After almost two weeks of Isaiah readings, we hear the foretelling of a Messiah from other prophets from the Hebrew Scriptures - in Sirach, Numbers, Zephaniah, and returning to Isaiah. With each passing week, the prophet speaks more clearly of the coming of a Savior.

So, in reading the first reading, for the first part of Advent, we listen to the anticipation, expectation, hope, and promise. In listening to the second reading, we listen for the fulfillment or connection with the gospel.



Part 2: December 17-24

In the Last eight days before Christmas, the relationship between the readings changes. Now the gospel brings us to our celebration of Christmas. The gospels are taken from the Infancy narratives of Matthew and Luke.

Each of these days, the first reading is taken from the Hebrew scriptures, and chosen to match the gospel. In many cases we can imagine Matthew or Luke having the first reading open on their desks while they wrote the gospel.

So, we can read the gospel first and then read the first reading. The sense of anticipation and fulfillment builds as we read the story for the preparation of Jesus' first coming into this world for us.

In the midst of all our preoccupations, may we be grateful for our many blessings.

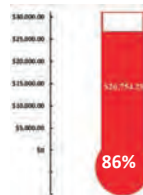

THE STM MATCHING GIFT CAMPAIGN FOR 2026

The official kick-off of the St. Thomas More Matching Gift Campaign for this year will take place early in 2026. This kick-off date was chosen to wait until after the holidays and to not conflict with the ongoing NH Catholic Appeal.

As you know, the Campaign typically has “pledgers” who promise contributions provided that amount is also collected from other “donators”. Last year, the Campaign had 3 pledgers and 35 donators, and we raised \$19,324, just a few dollars short of our goal of \$20,000! We understand that there are reasons why some Parishioners may prefer to donate to the Matching Gift Campaign BEFORE the end of Calendar Year 2025 and BEFORE the official kick-off of the Campaign. We will gladly accept either a pledge or a donation BEFORE the end of the Calendar year and apply that contribution to the 2026 Matching Gift Campaign. As always, any contribution will be very much appreciated. The income from the Campaign will again be absolutely critical to supporting our day-to-day Parish operations. It is one of our largest Parish fundraising efforts.

Donating to the Matching Gift Campaign NOW is EASY. Decide on the amount you would like to pledge or donate and simply write a check or initiate an electronic transfer to the “Church of St. Thomas More”. In the note or memo field indicate “2026 Matching Gift Campaign”. You can put your check in an envelope and drop it in the offertory basket at a Mass or mail it to Fr. Andy at the Parish Office. If you would like to remain anonymous, you can indicate that on the check as well. All who donate \$250 or more to the Matching Gift Campaign will receive a return thank you letter from the Parish that also documents the tax deductible status of your donation.

“Accept one another, then, as Christ accepted you, for the glory of God. Yes, I affirm that Christ, became the servant of the Jews because of God’s faithfulness in fulfilling the promises of the patriarchs, whereas the Gentiles glorify God because of his mercy. As scripture has it ‘therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles, and I will sing to your name.’”
